In math, we explored concepts of multiplication and division, area and perimeter, fractions, and problem solving. In writing, students chose an animal that they were interested in and wrote a research paper about it. In science and social studies, students continued to study rocks and minerals, the scientific method, soils, and even robotics. We look forward to seeing your child's science fair projects in April!

Next, students will continue to explore animals and their lifecycles, soils, and continue with the scientific method. They will write opinion and direction papers, and continue to explore fiction and nonfiction text. All this in preparation for the CRT and SBAC assessments in April and Sea World in May!
